## SHORT COURSE ON ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY

25<sup>th</sup>–30<sup>th</sup> June, 2018

### Overview:

The Rector of the College of African Wildlife Management (CAWM), Mweka, wishes to announce a one-week intensive course on ‘**Environmental Policy**’. The course is tailored mainly for professionals to expose them to the basics of environmental policy-making in developing countries (with a focus on Tanzania) while highlighting key issues related to climate change and sustainable development. At the end of the course the participants are expected to have covered topics related to economic tools for policy analysis, policy development process/framework for policy making, political aspects of stakeholder engagement/ stakeholder analysis, policy window of opportunities, hurdles to policy making in developing countries, sustainable development game play, policy implementation and evaluation and preparation of quality policy briefs. All these topics will be covered under three major sections:

- **SECTION 1: BASIC CONCEPTS** (*Environmental Policy Making in Developing Countries, Climate Change, and Sustainable Development*)
- **SECTION 2: COUNTRY-SPECIFIC** (*Environmental policy analysis of Protected Areas, climate change adaptation, and forest management in Tanzania*)
- **WRITING CENTER** (*Practical experience on writing a compelling Policy Brief related to a Tanzanian environmental issue*)

**Targeted course participants:**

The course on Environmental Policy targets professionals/practitioners interested in acquiring knowledge or improving skills in Environmental Policy making. Course participants may be from the public, private, non-profit, or community sector. The course assumes no prior learning or experience in policy analysis.

**Requirements for course participants:**

All participants will need to bring personal laptop computer to upload training materials.

**Language:**

The course will be conducted in English. Participants must possess basic English proficiency in order to follow the course and be actively involved in the training activities.

**Course fees:**

The fee charge is TZS 900,000 to cover for tuition, training materials and light refreshments should be paid directly to the College of African Wildlife Management Bank Account at **CRDB Ltd, Moshi Branch, Account No. 01J1039905500 OR NMB Ltd, Mawenzi Branch, Account No. 42206600034**. Note that course participants will have to cater for their own accommodation, food and transport costs to and from Mweka.

**Hours:**

Approximately 8 hours per day, for a total of 48 hours a week. This course is pass-fail and requires the completion of at least 65% (31 hours) of course material to receive a passing grade.

**Award at Conclusion of Course:**

Upon successful completion of the course, participants will be awarded a Certificate of Achievement from CAWM
