Description of the Tables above

Table 1: provides a summary of College's Fees paid directly to the College's Bank Accounts. These fees cover tuition, Students' Council (US\$ 20) and NACTE Annual Examinations (US \$ 40). These fees plus fees for accommodation on College's campus must be paid in full or in two instalments of 50% at the beginning of each semester. No student shall be allowed into the campus without paying College's Fees. College's Fees are subject to change annually to reflect changing economic and financial circumstances. Customers shall be informed accordingly.

Table 2: provides a summary of annual **estimated** costs to students on services and equipment that are not offered by the College.

Note that students will not be allowed to participate in the field training without standard uniforms that can be obtained at the College. Students shall also be required to bring their own beddings, if they opt to take College's accommodation.

ESSENTIAL INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS JOINING THE COLLEGE

This document contains only the most important information you should have in advance of your training programme at this College.

A: COLLEGE YEAR

The College year usually runs from the first week of August to mid June, with about 20 days New Year and 7 days mid-term breaks respectively.

B: LOCATION

The College is situated in Mweka village on the Southern slopes of Mount Kilimanjaro in Tanzania at an elevation of 1400 meters above sea level. It lies 14 kilometers North of Moshi town in an agricultural country with coffee as the principal cash crop.

Despite of its tropical location, Mweka enjoys a semi-temperate climate due to its elevation. There are two rain seasons a year, the long rains in March and June and the short rains in October and November. The weather is generally sunny although June to September can be cloudy and relatively cool. The nights can be chilly, mean temperatures varying between 17°C and 30°C with low humidity. It may be advantageous for you to bring warm clothing.

C: TRAVEL TO MWEKA

Mweka can be reached by road from Kilimanjaro International Airport (KIA) or from Moshi town. From Moshi town public transport to Mweka is available and taxis, although taxis are relatively expensive.

D: RESIDENCE

The College provides accommodation facilities for both female and male students and a dispensary where medical services are offered to both students and staff. All complicated medical cases requiring special investigation and specialist's attention are referred to Kibosho Hospital or the Kilimanjaro Christian Medical Centre (KCMC), which is one of the four consultant hospitals in the country.

E: STUDENTS HAVE COMPLETE FREEDOM OF WORSHIP

The Tanzanian Constitution provides for freedom of religion, and the Government generally respects this right in practice. On its part, the College allows students organized religious groups to worship on campus provided they do not break College regulations or the laws of the country.

F: GAMES AND SPORTS

Available sports facilities for indoor and outdoor games include a soccer (football) pitch; courts for tennis, squash, basketball and volleyball, table tennis, darts, badminton etc. It will be rewarding to bring with you sports gears.

CONDITIONS OF YOUR ADMISSION TO THE COLLEGE

1. Your admission was based on the academic qualification you submitted on your application forms which is subject to satisfactory verification. On your arrival you will be required to present your original academic certificates to be checked against the photocopies you attached on your application forms. If you have lost your original certificate(s) you must produce adequate statement to support your claim.
2. You should also bring with your PASSPORT SIZE PHOTOGRAPHS, EIGHT for non- Tanzanians and TWO for Tanzanians to be presented to the Course Coordinator on the registration date.
3. A minimum payment of 50% of long course fees must be paid before a student can be admitted to the course. The remaining balance must be paid no later than the start of the second semester or the student will be suspended until payment is received. If fees is paid by the sponsor, the College must have written evidence from your sponsor.
4. Fees once paid shall not be refunded except for conditions found in the College Fee Refund Policy. Students are advised to operate personal bank accounts for their personal use. Payments for personal expenses made through College Bank account will be charged Management fee of 15% of such amount.
5. The College has limited accommodation facilities which are offered on first come first served basis. Students opting or missing accommodation on campus have to acquire accommodation outside the College at a cost between US\$ 400 and US\$ 800 per annum and meet their daily travel expenses to the College and back to base.
6. The College does not offer cafeteria services. However, students may obtain cafeteria services at an outsourced College cafeteria and any other places outside the College premises.
7. You will be required to take all course subjects as required by the College for the entire period of your study.
8. NAME: Your name should be registered exactly as it appears on your passport or academic records (first name in full, middle name(s), and surname in capital and in full). These names will appear on all permanent records at the College.
9. There is a Students' Council, which all students belong. The students' Council is the official body for the organization of students' affairs and is the official organ of representation of the student body.
10. While you are a student at this College, you are free to use the College's address.
11. While you are a student at this College, you will not present yourself in any manner as an employee or representative of the College.
12. You should possess a health Insurance cover all the time while at the College, in order to access medical services. If you don't have you will be required to fill NHIF registration forms available at the College.
13. You will be required to put on field uniform all the time while in the field. The field uniform will be provided by the College after taking your cloth/shoe measurements (sizes).
14. Foreign students are required to report to the Dean of Students office as soon as they arrive at the College in order to process the study permits (Immigration).
