BACKGROUND

The College of African Wildlife Management, Mweka (Tanzania), in partnership with the Southern Africa Wildlife College (SAWC) and The Regional Post-Graduate Training School on Integrated Management of Tropical Forests and Lands (ERAIFT-DRC) is implementing a project on 'Climate Resilience and Natural Resource Management' funded by GIZ.
